Kapila Abhayawansa (PhD) Prof. Kapila Abhayawansa is a Buddhist scholar specializing in Pali, Sanskrit, and Buddhist philosophy, Western and Indian Philosophies. He is currently a permanent professor holding the posts of the Dean of the Faculty of Religious Studies and the Vice Rector for Academic Affairs at the International Buddhist College in Thailand.
