Furthermore, due to the lack of facilities and financial support the theory based education system has firmly established itself in Sri Lanka. Therefore, it is clear that we have inherited a system that fails to bring out the innovative talent in our students and we do not let them go beyond the books.

Hence, this theory - based education system is one of the biggest failures in the Sri Lankan education system and it pulls back the youth and get them stuck in a stereotypical system.
